Scripture: Matthew 1:18-25

GLORY TO GOD IN THE HIGHEST

"And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:8-11

That night in the fields near Bethlehem of Judea shepherds were given the glorious word from heaven. Never again will there be another night like this one. I suspect these shepherds kept sharing their experience as long as they lived. That night they heard the angelic message; they saw the baby lying in manger. They told all they had heard and seen. They spread the good news that this baby born in a stable is Christ the Lord. How many more nights did they look into the night sky and remember hearing and seeing the angel?
