

<u>Glorify God</u>

In our Sunday morning devotional time we are sharing those Scriptures that tell us about John.

Among the first things shared by Luke in his Gospel account is the announcement of John's birth. There are some special things shared by the Holy Spirit concerning him. In the next few weeks we plan to study further the whole ministry of John.

Jesus said of John: "Among those born of women there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist yet he who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." Matt. 11:11 In that context Jesus identifies John as the Elijah who was to come. Because of John's calling the people of God to be prepared for the coming kingdom, being the Lord's forerunner, he is honored for his faithfulness. Yet, for the comparison to John's service, all who enter into the Kingdom of God through faith in Jesus, even the very least are greater. The meaning is that the blessed privileges we have in the Kingdom of the Lord are so much greater than any found outside of the New Covenant. Before Jesus paid our debt of sin, before the victory over death and the grave came through the Lord's resurrection, God's promises were forwarded. But in Christ Jesus we have hold of eternal life. "He who believes in Me, has eternal life." John 3:36.

At John's birth following his father's prophecy concerning him, Luke adds: "The neighbors were all filled with awe, and throughout the hill country of Judea people were talking about all these things. Everyone who heard this wondered about it, asking 'What then is this child going to be?' For the hand of the Lord was with him." Have you thought about that last statement? At John's birth the hand of the Lord was with him.

The Scriptures say that God is with the righteous. Psalms One declares the Lord knows the way of the righteous. The description of blessings tells us of that which God provides for those who have chosen the pathway that honors Him and His Ways. For every disciple who comes to faith in Jesus, we are promised the indwelling Spirit of God. He lives and abides with us. What a special place to live with the Holy Spirit's presence. The hand of the Lord will surely be with us as we "*Walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son, purifies us from all sin.*" I John 1:7


